

Student Scholarship Program

Each year ACSA Region 1 will award scholarships during the month of May to graduating high school seniors who have a parent/caregiver who is a member of ACSA Region 1 and works in a school district in Region 1. The number of scholarships varies each year. Application packets are available on the [Region 1 website](#).

ELIGIBILITY– The applicant must:

1. Be a child of, or under the guardianship of, a Region 1 ACSA member.
2. Be a graduating high school senior in the year in which the scholarship is awarded.
3. Have a 3.0 minimum cumulative grade point average (unweighted).

CRITERIA FOR SELECTION:

1. Grade point average in courses completed.
2. In-school and outside-of-school participation in leadership and activities.
3. Plans for college and/or future career training.

APPLICATION PROCESS

1. The completed application must consist of the following five items:
 - ┌ An essay not to exceed 300 words dealing with the importance of having advanced education/training.
 - ┌ An application form filled out by the applicant.
 - ┌ A copy of the applicant's transcripts in a sealed envelope.
 - ┌ Three letters of recommendation, each sealed in an envelope by the reference person, at least one must be from a staff member.
2. A completed application must be postmarked by **April 15th** and sent to the current Region 1 President. (Refer to ACSA [Region 1 website](#) for address of current Region 1 president.)
