## **Student Scholarship Program**

Each year ACSA Region 1 will award scholarships during the month of May to graduating high school seniors who have a parent/caregiver who is a member of ACSA Region 1 and works in a school district in Region 1. The number of scholarships varies each year. Application packets are available on the Region 1 website.

#### **ELIGIBILITY** – The applicant must:

- 1. Be a child of, or under the guardianship of, a Region 1 ACSA member.
- 2. Be a graduating high school senior in the year in which the scholarship is awarded.
- 3. Have a 3.0 minimum cumulative grade point average (unweighted).

#### **CRITERIA FOR SELECTION:**

- 1. Grade point average in courses completed.
- 2. In-school and outside-of-school participation in leadership and activities.
- 3. Plans for college and/or future career training.

#### **APPLICATION PROCESS**

1 11	e completed application must consist of the following <u>five</u> items:
J	An essay not to exceed 300 words dealing with the importance of having advanced education/training.
	An application form filled out by the applicant.
	A copy of the applicant's transcripts in a sealed envelope.
	Three letters of recommendation, each <u>sealed</u> in an envelope by the reference person, at least one must be from a staff member.

2. A completed application must be postmarked by **April 15<sup>th</sup>** and sent to the current Region 1 President. (Refer to ACSA <u>Region 1 website</u> for address of current Region 1 president.)
